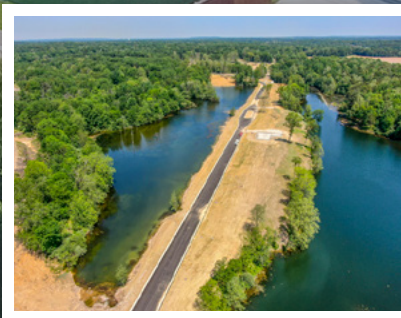

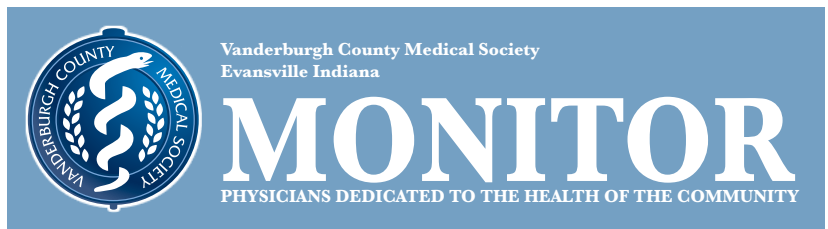

He was a widower with two small boys, a physician from a small town in southern Indiana. She was a divorcee with a four-year-old son of her own from a small town in the boot heel of Missouri. His sister's husband was an old friend of her stepfather, and since matchmaking is the true oldest profession, they thought that the two would be perfect for each other and arranged their first date, a properly chaperoned visit to her mother's home in East Prairie. As it turned out, they were absolutely right, and Mother and Dad both said that when they met, it was love at first sight. They would have a grand total of six dates before they married, each date a Chaperoned weekend at the family home of one or the other. Each date, that is, except the last one.



For this date, Dad had arranged a long Fourth of July weekend at his cabin on Kentucky Lake. It would also be chaperoned, but this time by his sister Emily and her husband, Jim.

Two more cooperative and convivial chaperones could not have been found. (Not that it mattered. Those were the days when love and marriage went together like a horse and carriage, and Dad literally was told by Mother, you can't have one without the other.) The last time they were together, Dad had stayed up almost all night Friday and Saturday and didn't start home to Boonville until midnight Sunday.

When he was awakened by the screech of the right front fender against the railing of the Mississippi River Bridge, he decided that something had to change, and he was going to ask Kay to marry him.

The day they got to the cabin, he said, "Kay, I love you, and I am asking you to marry me. I need to tell you that I am moving to Minneapolis to do my residency in six months. I will get paid next to nothing, but I think I have saved enough money that we can make it.

Guy and Mike will be your sons, and Alan will be mine, and next week I, I hope, have to go to Denver so that I can get my internship records. And one more thing, I have promised the boys' maternal grandmother, who lives in Nebraska, that on the way out, we will visit her so she can see her grandsons." Mother, who despised cold weather, did not hesitate to say yes and say it enthusiastically (She would later say that Minneapolis had two seasons, winter and the Fourth of July.) She would always say that this was the happiest moment of her life, and she loved my grandmother from the first time she met her, but she did have one proviso. "I refuse to be married on the Fourth of July." That left the third of July wide open, but there was a three-day waiting period in Kentucky. However, no such restrictive prohibition existed in Illinois, so it was settled.

They would get the license and be married by a justice of the peace in Metropolis, Illinois, on July 3. Uncle Jim and Aunt Emily were happy to stand up with them and be witnesses.

The cabin had electricity but no running water. A five-gallon can with a spigot, hauled in every trip, served as the only water source (save the lake, of course. "I am not bathing in the lake.") In deference to the bride-to-be, she was allowed the first wash pan of water. Uncle Jim arranged the wedding feast, making four ham sandwiches, wrapping them in wax paper, and shoving them in his pockets. Everybody piled into the car, and they headed to Metropolis. It was quite a ceremony. Mother said that the justice of the peace had such bad breath that the wedding couple kept backing away from him, but he just kept coming forward until their backs were against the wall. Jim and Emily found it quite amusing and did everything they could to make the prospective bride and groom laugh, holding their noses and making the hanged man sign.

They had packed the car and closed the cabin before going to Metropolis, as the plan was to drive straight back to Evansville so Dad and Mother could enjoy their wedding night at the Hotel McCurdy. The wedding dinner was

consumed on the road. That night, as the temperature soared to a pleasant 98 degrees (I'm sure it came down to 88 after dark), they enjoyed one of Evansville's finest hotels' most luxurious and non-air-conditioned rooms.

The next day they came to Boonville, and Dad introduced our new mother the day after that, we all drove to East Prairie to pick up Alan. Mother said that when we got there, I jumped out of the car and said to him, "Hi, Alan. We're your new brothers, and we're all going on a honeymoon." Which we did, Dad, Mother, and their three little boys, off to Denver by way of Nebraska, but that is another story.

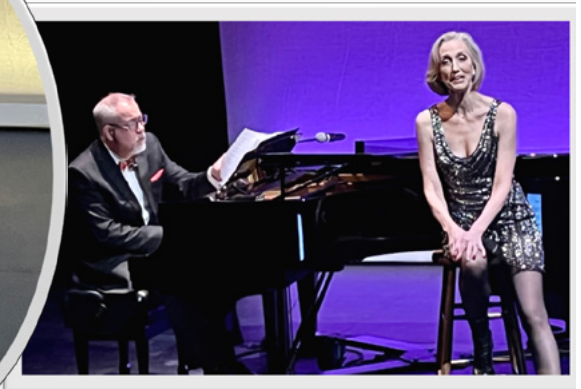
