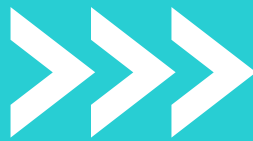

# EVERYTHING THAT YOU WANT, EVERYTHING THAT YOU NEED

There aren't many doctors still practicing who were in business when Medicare became the law of the land. If you are, God bless you, and I hope you never have to quit. However, there are still quite a few of us who worked at least some time under the original Medicare law. The only trouble is that we can't remember that far back.

I'm only kidding, I remember, and I'm sure you do too. I'd like to amaze the many Diaper Dandies who came after us exactly how it was in those days.

Under the original law, Medicare paid doctors one hundred percent of their reasonable and customary fees, except for co-pay and deductible. Yes, you read me right, one hundred percent, and the doctors got to set their own fees. Hospitals were paid their costs plus ten percent. You're way ahead of me. Yes, that gave physicians a huge incentive to set their fees as high as possible, especially since they were not allowed to increase them thereafter. Of course, hospitals did better the higher their costs were, so their incentive was to increase their costs as much as possible.

Hence the five-dollar aspirin tablet. (During my residency at a huge city-county hospital, which had a long history of struggling financially, aspirin, acetaminophen, Benadryl, and other commonly used tablets were kept in giant jars, and the nurses took out what the patients needed and gave it to them in a pill cup. Milk-of-magnesia and Maalox were in gallon jugs and given the same way. Somehow when the cost was no longer an object and, in fact, was encouraged, these practices gradually became too unsanitary and dangerous.)

As you can imagine, these were glory days for doctors and hospitals.

Seniors, who as a group had previously been able to pay less than twenty percent of their medical bills, and who had received much of their care for free, or had not been able to afford care at all, were now having one hundred percent of their bills paid. It was good for patients and great for doctors and hospitals, who now were getting more money than they had ever dreamed of.

Obviously, it was not good for the federal budget. (Medicare is still the greatest thing in the world for seniors. I should know. Sadly, Medicare and Medicaid only survive because of the altruism of doctors.)

We can all see this was unsustainable, and indeed many Cassandras, doctors, and economists had warned that such a system would be so. It only took the federal government eighteen years to see it too. Enter the DRGs, and diagnosis-related groups, which we still have today. This system determined that there were 467 groups of diagnoses and was basically the price-fixing system we enjoy today. Like all price fixing systems, it is rigid and inadequate medically and economically. It ignores the huge increases doctors have in the cost of their practices and has allowed increases in fees over the last forty years that are only a tiny percent of this increased cost. (In 2015, I mentioned to a patient that the Medicare allowed fee for a cholecystectomy was four hundred and fifty dollars, which was the same as what my professor charged in 1975. Nonplussed, he responded, "He was charging too much back then.")

I guess the point I'm trying to make here is that everything we need for free (of course, there is no "free," there is only taxpayer funded) is always unsustainable, and that is true, especially for medicine. There isn't enough money for three hundred million people to live forever. We, as doctors, have to be the leaders in finding ways to realistically and equitably distribute a limited asset. You needed to add a little more work to your already busy schedule, didn't you?

# HOW EVERY DOCTOR SHOULD ADDRESS A PATIENT'S PAIN

From medical school to residency, I've worked with colleagues who don't prescribe pain medications for their patients who truly need them. Or they are just very hesitant about doing so. Some simply don't believe in them. Others fear the legal implications like being named to a med mal or wrongful death lawsuit. And several avoid pain meds, specifically opioids, like the plague because of possible addiction risk even when their long-standing home med is an opioid prescribed by their PCP.

When it came to working with residents who didn't believe in the efficacy of pain meds, it became a literal pain (pun intended) for me, the nurses, and the patient. The pain ladder exists for a reason: Tylenol to Tramadol to Norco. Not believing a patient is in pain, or at worse believing they can tough it out, is dangerous. Poor wound healing, infections, heart strain (even worse for patients with heart problems), poor sleep, anxiety, and depression are only a fraction of the possible complications. More doctors need to realize that not treating a patient's pain can lead to a rabbit hole of consequences.

So how should a doctor approach pain? Of course, we start with the basics: Is the patient on any pain meds currently? Any opioids? Is this pain different from their usual pain? How bad is their pain?

But even before that, we must think about the cause because pain is an underdiagnosed diagnosis. Or at worse, diagnosed but grossly undermanaged. Oftentimes, the cause is clear-cut. A patient just had surgery, or a patient has cancer. A patient was in an accident or had a fall. But, what if the patient has pain stemming from a less clear or more complicated cause? Like psychological distress or CRPS (complex regional pain syndrome)? What about radiculopathy or drug toxicity? And sometimes, a patient has pain with no identifiable cause or pain due to overall poor health (smoking, obesity, sleep deprivation, etc.).

Coming down to it, the approach to pain should be the physician at the very least showing sympathy to the patient. Every single one of us has been in pain at some point in our lives. So we all know what pain feels like and what it can do to a person's physical body and mental state. To shrug off a patient's ask for something for pain because it isn't the main problem is careless and disheartening. Pain should be taken seriously because it can be debilitating to the patient.

Yes, as doctors, we must be aware of how many pain meds the patient is getting, does their regimen consist of an opioid, and what exactly is their history of taking pain meds. We have to do our due diligence while at the same time not ignoring what the patient in front of us is saying and how they appear to our eyes. If a patient's pain is uncontrolled, it can quickly lead to them distrusting the care team and medicine. They would no longer want to participate in their own care, which defeats the patient-centered care model we all like to champion, but only a few of us do so. Let's do better when it comes to addressing a patient's pain.

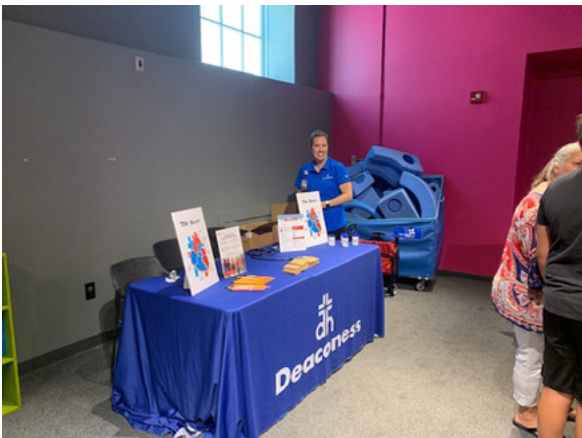
